2019-20 Season Awards – March 30, 2020

Wrestler of the Year: Paul Detwiler – So. 184lbs, United States Coast Guard Academy

The Bear sophomore compiled a 28-0 record for the 2019-20 season that included 18 Bonus point victories. He also became only the second Coast Guard wrestler to win the All Academy Championships. Detwiler won championships at the Doug Parker, Ted Reese, and Jim Aguilar tournaments, was the OW at the NEWA Dual championships, won the Northeast Region tournament, and was the #2 seed at the NCAA Championships. The Marine and Environmental Science major sports a 3.74 GPA and was named to the Scholar All-American team.

Rookie Wrestler of the Year: Hayden Brown - 133 lbs, Johnson & Wales University

Hayden had a phenomenal year going 37-5 with 17 falls. He was the winner of the Ithaca Invitational and RWU invitational while having his freshman year culminate with the NCAA Northeast Region Title. Hayden was seeded at the #5 slot at this Year's NCAA Championships where he was also honored as a Scholar All-American.

Co-Most Dominant Wrestler Award: Evan Fidelibus – Jr. 149lbs, New England College and Michael DiNardo – Sr. 285lbs, Johnson & Wales University

Fidelibus completed a 43-3 season that included a 30 match win streak that lasted to the finals of the Northeast regional championships. Of his 43 wins, 22 ended in a fall with 13 of those in under a minute. He averaged an average team point of 4.53 during the 19-20 dual meet season.

DiNardo had 50 matches for the season going 44-6 on the year. The 44 Wins not only led the country in that statistical category, the 26 Pins DiNardo accumulated was also the nation's best. He was the RWU Invite Champion, New Standard Invite Champion, and the 2020 Northeast Region Champion where he pinned everyone he faced to earn the Gorriaran Trophy (Most Falls) for the tournament. DiNardo finished his Career as a 4x All -Region Wrestler with 151 wins and 75 pins. He had a career pin to match ratio of 41%.

Scholar Athlete of the Year: Tyler Marsh – Sr. 165lbs, Worcester Polytechnic Institute

The Engineer senior was undefeated in NEWA dual meets this season and completed a 29-5 overall record. He closed out his career as a 4x Scholar All-American, 4x Northeast Regional placer (4th, 2nd, 1st, 3rd), a 2x Region Finalist, and 3x National Qualifier. He carries a 3.92 cumulative GPA, with a 4.0 GPA for the last four consecutive semesters, in Mechanical Engineering.

Coach of the Year: Jay Holder, Springfield College

Completing his 9th year as head coach, the Holder led Pride posted a 17-5 dual meet record for the 2019-20 season and wrapped up the year by placing 4th at the Northeast Regional Championships with four national qualifiers. Springfield College also had seven Scholar All-Americans and a team GPA that placed them 6th nationally.

Assistant Coach of the Year: Dylan Foley, United States Coast Guard Academy

Foley garners his 2nd consecutive NEWA Assistant Coach of the Year award after the USCGA finished the season ranked seventh nationally. The Bears placed second at the NCAA Division III Northeast Regional for the second straight season, finished 6-2 in dual meets, and had six wrestlers qualify for the NCAA Division III Championship
